

RESOLUTION
SUPPORTING GENERAL ASSEMBLY, UNITED NATIONS RESOLUTION FOR
CONVENING OF SPECIAL SESSION ON DISARMAMENT 4

Recalling the Special Session on Disarmament 2 of the General Assembly of the United Nations in 1982 that sparked the largest mobilization for peace in the history of the world;

Recalling the resolutions of the Heads of States of Non-Aligned Countries in Kuala Lumpur in February, 2003 and the Final Document of the Ministerial Conference on the Non-Aligned Movement in Durban, South Africa calling for a Special Session on Disarmament »to review....the most critical aspects of disarmament and to mobilize the international community and public opinion in favour of the elimination of nuclear and other weapons of mass destruction and of control and reduction of conventional weapons«;

Recalling also the United Nations Millennium Declaration, adopted by Heads of States and Governments, resolving »to strive for the elimination of weapons of mass destruction, particularly nuclear weapons, and to keep all options open for achieving this aim, including the possibility of convening an international conference to identify ways of eliminating nuclear dangers«

The General Assembly of the International Association of Peace Messenger Cities, meeting on September 2, 2005 in Slovenj Gradec, Slovenia unanimously endorses Resolution 59/71, passed by the General Assembly of the United Nations on December 3, 2004 in Plenary meeting, establishing a working group to consider the possible establishment of the preparatory committee for the fourth special session of the General Assembly devoted to disarmament and to set dates for substantive sessions in 2006 and submit possible substantive recommendations before the present sixtieth session of the General Assembly.
